It was followed by a group dance which was performed by the students from classes I-V.

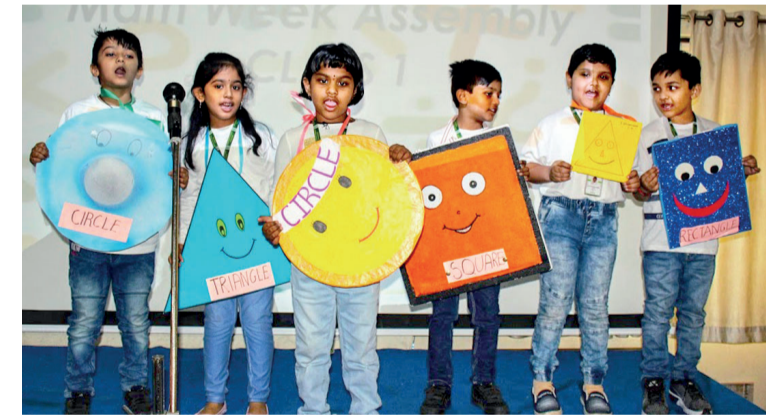
The celebrations came to an end with rendition of Christmas carols sung by the teachers.
