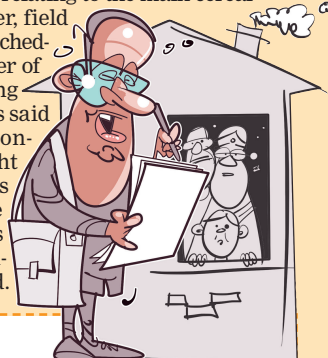
INTERNET INTRINSIC, SAYS SC



Ruling that the right to access the internet is a fundamental right under Article 19 of the Constitution, the Supreme Court recently ordered the Jammu and Kashmir Administration to restore internet services in all institutions providing essential services like hospitals and educational centres. Delivering its order on petitions challenging the restrictions imposed in the Union Territory following the abrogation of special provisions of Article 370 of the Constitution in August last year, the apex court said restrictions on fundamental rights cannot be done by the arbitrary exercise of power.

WHAT'S A FIRST CENSUS & CEREAL MATTER

The Centre has notified 31 fields of information to be sought during the Houselisting and Housing Census phase of Census 2021, which include a new field relating to the main cereal consumed in the household. However, field number 33 in the earlier Houselisting schedule approved for Census 2011 – number of household members availing banking services – has been dropped. Sources said information on the main cereal consumed in the household, being sought for the first time as part of the Census exercise, has been included in the Houselisting and Housing Census schedule as it will give a crucial insight into food habits of a household.



WHAT IS CENSUS?

■ Census is the basis for reviewing the country's progress in the past decade, monitoring the ongoing schemes of the government and plan for the future. ■ Census provides detailed and authentic information on demography, economic activity, literacy and education, housing and household amenities, urbanisation, fertility and mortality, scheduled castes and scheduled tribes, language, religion, migration, disability and many other socio-cultural and demographic data.

THE FIRST CENSUS

The first complete census of India was conducted in 1830 by Henry Walter in Dacca (now Dhaka). In this census, statistics of the population with sex, broad age group, their residences, along with amenities was collected.

Little Women, A Beautiful Day In The Neighborhood get India release dates

After creating a buzz in the award season, Tom Hanks' 'A Beautiful Day In The Neighborhood' and Greta Gerwig's 'Little Women' will soon release in India. In the former, Hanks will be seen as Mister Rogers in the film, which has been shot in and around the Pittsburgh area. It will release in India on January 17. Gerwig's 'Little Women' retells Louisa May Alcott's much-loved 19th-century novel about four women coming of age. The film will open in India on February 7.

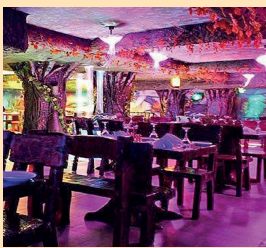

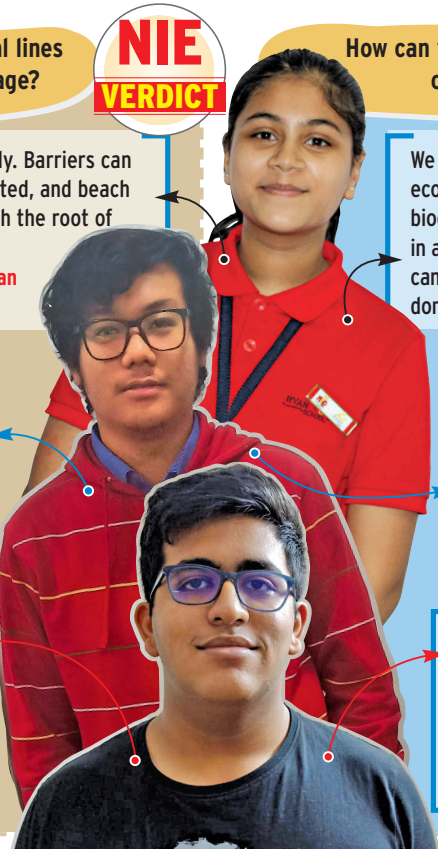
Apart from meeting carbon emission targets in every possible way, we also need to grow mangroves all along the coast.

UK's Prince Harry and wife Meghan Markle have announced quitting their front-line roles to focus on the "next chapter" – stunning the monarchy. How new life sprouts after a forest fire

Despite the damage that can occur to property and people, good things can emerge from forest fires too...

Forest fires are a natural and necessary part of the ecosystem, states howstuffworks.com, quoting scientific journals. Even healthy forests contain dead trees and decaying plant matter; when a fire turns them to ashes, nutrients return to the soil instead of remaining captive in old vegetation. ■ When fire rages through dry underbrush, it clears thick growth so that sunlight can reach the



forest floor and encourage the growth of native species. ■ Fire frees these plants from the competition delivered by invasive weeds and eliminates diseases or droves of insects. ■ Most

healthy and young trees are resilient enough to survive a forest fire and have a growth spurt, owing to flames that burnt down the trees that were earlier obstructing sunlight.

Tracking threats from the distant corners of space

There are millions of asteroids in the Solar System. Most of them keep to themselves as they orbit the Sun. But a subset of these asteroids have orbits that come in a little too close and cross the orbit of Earth around the Sun. Check them out

1 The biggest asteroid to fly past the planet in 2020 will be the huge four-kilometre wide 52768 (1998 OR2) travelling at 31,320 kmph
Asteroid 52768 (1998 OR2)
Arrival: April 29, 2020
Size: 1.8-4.1 km; Distance from Earth: 6.3 million km

2 Asteroid 136795 (1997 BQ) comes in second but it's still a kilometre wide. It's also faster, travelling at 42,048 kmph
Asteroid 136795 (1997 BQ)
Arrival: May 21, 2020
Size: 640 m to 1.4 km Distance from Earth: 6.2 million km

3 Only a few metres short of being a kilometre wide, Asteroid 163373 (2002 PZ39) will be the third biggest to approach Earth on Feb 15, 2020. Asteroid 163373 (2002 PZ39)
